Emergency Global Surgery - Case Studies

Dates: May 26 - 28, 2017

Venue: Experimental & Research Center ELPEN

Description/Purpose of Activity

Today, according to the WHO, approximately 2 billion people are lacking access to basic surgical care, leading to significant morbidity and mortality. If we consider that the training model in current surgical education has been increasingly towards specialization, given the increased amount and complexity of knowledge, we can see that there is a need to provide surgeons with a more "generalist" approach, in order for them to be more effective, especially in areas with overwhelmed medical systems. The role of the general and emergency surgeon in the field of high-quality universal health care delivery is, nowadays, considered to be extremely important for the efficient functioning of every health system.

The goal of this workshop is to address the needs that young physicians have, in order to be able to function in a low-resource environment and treat basic general and emergency surgical problems. In under-developed and developing countries the surgical practitioner has to be a true "generalist", able to handle and effectively manage an array of surgical conditions.

Considering the current financial crisis, that affects almost every part of the world, the modern physician has to be fully able to quickly develop a therapeutic plan that is both patient-centered and cost-effective in its implementation. Furthermore, the humanitarian aspect of the doctor-patient relationship leads the medical community to the conclusion that equitable surgical care services should be universally available and affordable.

Particularly in Greece, such innovative courses are indispensable and believed to be especially fruitful for the next generation of medical doctors in the long term. The heavy financial austerity measures of the last years, as well as the large influx of war-driven refugees and migrants from the Middle East have developed the need to scale up the level and efficiency of all medical services provided, and especially the role of surgery in this regard.

Targeted Audience

Our 3-day course will be addressed to physicians and residents, as well as senior medical students. It is going to provide skills training and theoretical education in a number of basic surgical procedures presented through case studies, and would be of interest to any health professional interested in humanitarian and emergency surgery.

According to the demand, the clinical skills training part of our course will be mostly available to physicians and final-year medical students, with the theoretical part being available to other health care professionals and younger medical students for observation.

Since many of the ACS faculty members that will participate as speakers and instructors in the course are also faculty members in academic university institutions, wide dissemination of the course is sure to raise the awareness of the need of universal high-quality health care among medical students throughout Greece. Thus, medical students will be strongly motivated to observe the course and even take part in the training practical cases, if they are in their final year of studies.

This course has the added advantage that it presents an educational tool(skills-based learning and case-based learning) which although it has been extensively validated in several international educational systems, it is still lacking from the Greek medical educational armamentarium.

Learning Objectives

- Become acquainted with the procedural steps of basic surgical skills and operations, within different surgical subspecialties. By the end of the course, the participants will be expected to have understood the rationale behind the basic surgical approach to the patient, especially in the emergency setting.
- Refresh the basic knowledge of structured clinical approach and differential diagnosis in the emergency department and of basic imaging and laboratory procedures that are most often used as a primary helping tool in the diagnosis and management in low-resource settings.
- Develop awareness and sensitivity, regarding the aspect of humanitarian surgery in low-income countries and in situations with little resources. The need for global equality in surgical and anesthesia care regardless of a country's financial standing is also to be analyzed and explained.
